DISCIPLINARY COMPLAINT RESOLUTION AGREEMENT

pursuant to section 55(2)(a.1) of the Health Professions Act

BETWEEN:

ROGELIO EUGENIO, #134,854 (the "Registrant")

and

College of Registered Nurses of Alberta (the "College")

A Disciplinary Complaint Resolution Agreement ("**DCRA**") was executed between the Registrant and the College, dated with effect February 17, 2025. The below constitutes a summary of such DCRA:

Through an Agreement with the College, ROGELIO EUGENIO, #134,854 (the "Registrant"), acknowledged and admitted that their behaviour constituted unprofessional conduct. Particulars of the Registrant's unprofessional conduct arises from one (1) complaint to the College include the following:

- Between December 9 and 11, 2024, the Registrant failed to adequately prioritize the care of several patients and failed to demonstrate adequate clinical judgment, when they:
 - failed to administer a morning enteral feed to Patient 1, who had an order for an enteral feed that had not been discontinued;
 - failed to take reasonable and timely actions to address clinical concerns or contact a physician for assistance, when Patient 2 was experiencing hypotension and low magnesium levels;
 - failed to take reasonable and timely actions to address clinical concerns, perform a cardiac or stroke assessment or contact a physician for assistance, when Patient 3 was experiencing chest pain; or
 - failed to assess and provide care to Patient 4, who was tachycardic and experiencing an irregular pulse;
- Between December 9 and 11, 2024, the Registrant failed to adequately document their care of several patients, when they:
 - failed to document a missed morning enteral feed for Patient 1;
 - failed to document vitals for Patient 2, who was experiencing hypotension and low magnesium levels;

- failed to adequately document Patient 2's hypotension or any interventions performed to address the hypotension;
- failed to document further monitoring of Patient 3, who was experiencing chest pain;
- failed to document any care to Patient 4 prior to a patient transfer to Calgary for an endoscopic retrograde cholangiopancreatography (ERCP); or
- failed to document a lumbar puncture and the collection of sample from Patient 5.
- Between December 10 and 11, 2024, the Registrant failed to adequately follow infection prevention and control standards, when they failed to consult or review the Creutzfeld-Jacob Disease Precautions Practice Direction Manual to ensure proper protocols were followed to prepare for, handle, or transport the collected sample from Patient 5.

The Registrant agreed to complete coursework on documentation, health assessment, infection prevention, and the nursing process. The Registrant further agreed to provide employer references covering a total of 100 nursing practice hours. Conditions shall appear on the College register and on the Registrant's practice permit.
